

Lidia Zielińska is a Polish composer. She studied composition with Andrzej Koszewski at the State High School of Music in Poznan. She has worked at the electronic music studios in Cracow, Stuttgart, Swedish Radio Malmoe, Experimental Studio of Polish Radio in Warsaw, IPEM/BRT in Ghent, EMS in Stockholm, ZKM in Karlsruhe and Experimentalstudio des SWR Freiburg.

Lidia Zielińska currently holds the post of professor of composition and head of the SMEAMuz Studio of Electroacoustic Music at Poznan's Music Academy; she also was a professor in sonology at the Academy of Fine Arts in Poznan (1989-92 and 2001-10). She has conducted summer courses, workshops and seminars, published and lectured extensively on contemporary Polish music, the history of experimental music, sound ecology and traditional Japanese music, on the invitation of universities in Europe, Americas, Asia, Australia and New Zealand.

For many years, Lidia Zielińska has fulfilled many official functions; she is currently Vice-President of the Polish Association for Electroacoustic Music, former Vice-President of the Board of the Polish Composers' Union, member of the programme committee of the Warsaw Autumn Festival (1989–92 and 1996–2005), of the ISCM World Music Days in Warsaw, of the Musica Electronica Nova in Wroclaw.
